Rudolf Giuliani

Former Mayor, New York City

Chair, Cybersecurity, Privacy and Crisis Management Practice, Greenberg Traurig, LLP

Former New York City Mayor Rudolph W. Giuliani, serves as Chair of the Cybersecurity, Privacy and Crisis Management Practice at Greenberg Traurig. He is also the founder of Giuliani Partners, a leading professional services firm in emergency preparedness, public safety, leadership during crises, and financial management. Rudy gained notoriety as Mayor of New York City from 1994-2001. His leadership in the wake of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks has been hailed by world figures. Prior to becoming Mayor, Rudy served as U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York from 1983-1989, where he led the effort to jail drug dealers, fight organized crime, break the web of corruption in government, and prosecute white collar criminals. During his high-profile prosecutorial career, he secured 4,152 convictions with only 25 reversals. In 1981, President Reagan appointed Rudy to the post of Associate Attorney General, the third highest position in the Department of Justice. Rudy also has handled numerous high profile trial matters during his career, including landmark cases as U.S. Attorney and arguments before the U.S. Supreme Court. He continues to handle high level litigation matters and recently was retained by a major public company for which he obtained a complete victory. Rudy served as the Vice-Chairman of the Donald J. Trump Presidential Transition Team. He leads a group of private sector representatives who share information about cyber security with President Trump and the Administration.

Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV)

Senator Joe Manchin was born and raised in the small coal mining town of Farmington, WV. As a state legislator, Governor and now Senator, Senator Manchin has always been committed to his philosophy of “retail government” - in other words, connecting with all of his constituents and making service to them his top priority. Senator Manchin currently serves on the Senate Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, and the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

Jadwiga Emilewicz

Undersecretary of State at Poland's Ministry of Economic Development

Jadwiga Emilewicz supervises the implementation of the Digital Poland 2014-2020 Program and is responsible for the strategic implementation of economic programs, and for activities conducive to the growth, competitiveness and innovation in the Polish economy. She is a councilor of the Małopolska Regional Assembly and the Chairperson of the Innovation and New Technology Committee, and a former a scholar of the Oxford University and the American Council on Germany, Dräger Foundation.

Will Hudson

Senior Advisor for International Policy at Google Inc.

Will Hudson is Senior Advisor for International Policy at Google, where his work focuses on Internet governance, Google's relationship with international organizations like the United Nations, and other international policy issues. Before joining Google, Will was Director for International Cyber Policy at the National Security Council. There, he was responsible for coordinating the government's implementation of a range of technology policies, including those relating to Internet governance, Internet freedom, human rights issues associated with data privacy and online surveillance, and cyber capacity building. Prior to his time in the White House, Will served in a variety of positions in the federal government, advising clients on the legal and policy issues associated with cybersecurity, norms of state and non-state behavior online, and emerging technologies. He is a board member of the U.S. Telecommunications Training Institute and the Journal of Law & Cyber Warfare, and is a Corporate Leader at the Council on Foreign Relations. He previously served as a non-resident fellow at Princeton University's Center for Information Technology Policy. Will is a graduate of Stanford University and Georgetown University Law Center.

John Miller

Vice President for Global Policy and Law, Cybersecurity and Privacy at the Information Technology Industry Council (ITI)

Miller currently leads ITI's global policy work on cybersecurity, privacy and data protection, surveillance, encryption and related global policy issues. Prior to ITI, Miller worked for nearly a decade in the Global Public Policy organization at Intel Corporation. In his most recent position at Intel, Miller served as the company's Director of Cybersecurity Policy and Government Relations and Managing Counsel, where he spearheaded global policy strategy development and advocacy efforts on issues including cybersecurity threat information sharing and electronic surveillance and communications privacy. In this role, Miller also directed Intel's U.S. cybersecurity policy strategy and federal government engagements, including Intel's implementation of the Cybersecurity Framework pursuant to Executive Order 13636: Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity. Earlier in his career, Miller led Intel's privacy and security policy strategy and outreach efforts in the Asia-Pacific region. In 2015 Miller served as Chair of the Information Technology Sector Coordinating Council;

currently he serves as the organization's Treasurer. Prior to joining Intel, Miller was an attorney in private law practice, representing corporate clients in a variety of complex business and intellectual property litigations and regulatory investigations. Miller received his J.D. from the University of Wisconsin Law School and his B.A., summa cum laude, from Hamilton College.

Abigail Slater

General Counsel at the Internet Association

At the IA, Gail is an advocate for IA members on public policy issues before the courts and regulatory agencies. She also works to build out the IA's presence overseas, in particular in the EU.
